Outreach to homeless and runaway teenagers living on the streets, in abandoned buildings, in camps, etc. Nurturance, hot meals, shower, laundry facilities and emergency clothing, counseling and referral services. On-site case manager for assessment, independent study and preparation for GED or school referral and placement. Referrals for medical and dental care. Preparation for employment. Overnight shelter for at-risk adolescents ages 12 - 17. Opportunity for recreation and socialization.
