Intake: Referral from law enforcement, Health and Human Services Department or court order

Eligibility: Ambulatory, ages 1 – 17

24-hours emergency, short-term shelter-care for abused or neglected children from Sacramento County. Counseling, 24-hour staffing, social work intervention, medical care, activities, recreation and an on-site school.

Services and programs include Women to Work program (women's learning and support group), culturally appropriate domestic violence intervention, community presentations and consultation, Wish List, and volunteer opportunities.

Languages: Spanish; ASL, Hmong, Russian, Tagalog by appointment

Intake: Telephone

Eligibility: Male or female victims of domestic violence and sexual assault

Temporary shelter and support services to victims of domestic violence and their children who are in crisis and need a safe place to stay; social service advocacy and referrals; emergency transportation, food and clothing; child abuse identification and intervention; and legal information and referral.

Needs assessment, information and referral, follow-up, client advocacy, crisis intervention, and food distribution. Limited emergency rental assistance and motel voucher programs.

Intake: Telephone (No walk-ins)

Eligibility: Sacramento County homeless families (with children) and single parents with kids, with no other resources. Temporary emergency shelter, meals, transportation, health services and clothing for those housed at SAEHC, within the limit of available resources. Length of stay determined by need and ability to function within shelter rules, up to 60 days. Counseling and case work services, assistance in locating permanent housing and transitional housing programs. Medical referral and medical care for children. Information and referral. Workshops in parenting and money management for residents. Children's services. Sacramento City Unified School District Homeless Education services for grades 1-12; Head Start for ages 3-kindergarten.

Hours: Seven days a week, 24-hours

Languages: Most languages by arrangement

Intake: Telephone; must contact shelter daily to stay on waiting list

Eligibility: Single women or women with children; male children no older than 14 years of age. Emergency shelter for single women or women with children for 60 days; serving 3 meals and 2 snacks a day; referral and advocacy services. Children may enroll in Preschool and Mustard Seed School. Access to counselors and group support. Staff works with guests to develop a plan regarding their options when the 60 days stay is over. Waiting list.

Intake: Telephone only

Eligibility: Single women in Sacramento County without housing

Temporary emergency shelter, meals and transportation. Housing limited to 30 days. Case management, assistance in locating permanent housing and jobs. Information and referral. Workshops in coping skills and money management for residents. Transitional housing program through SAEHC's extended shelter available to women saving for permanent housing. Program requires continued case management. Drug, alcohol counseling available.

Salvation Army

Intake: Walk-in Only, Monday – Friday, 1pm

Eligibility: Ages 18+

Lodging and meals for homeless single men and women with a support system of multiple resources and special programs. Job development, computer training, employment counseling, mental health services, recreational activities, substance abuse counseling, Alcoholics Anonymous, alternative housing, spiritual counseling, chapel service and bible studies are offered. Casework, counseling, and referral services provided to address other areas of need. Haircut vouchers available for clients only.

Attendance at Gospel service each day at 7 pm is mandatory. Dinner at 8:30 pm. Lunch is served Sundays after the 11am service. Meals are open to everyone who attends the service - men, women and children. Clothing and shower for men available M-Th 9-11am, 1-2:45 pm, Friday 9-11am.

Free clinic for teens the last Friday of each month 9 – 11:30 am.
